#1 - Innovate and improve City services to enhance quality, value, and

accessibility for all of our residents.

Reason For Report:

Staff has prepared this report in response to questions raised about operational efficiency since the City placed Animal Welfare Committee activities on hold in July 2023.

The Animal Control program is currently staffed by two officers, one full time and one part time. The part time ACO, joined staff on April 15th and will begin unaccompanied patrol of the City with the start of the new fiscal year on or about July 1, 2024.

For calendar year 2023, the full time ACO has worked with on-call staff, registered foster care providers, and through the Laurel Petco location to care for a number of cats, dogs and other species. All while responding to 266 calls for service throughout the City. These calls for service include the collection of animals from across the City, returning them to their owners, relocating them with foster care providers and transporting them to facilities outside of the City to such as the Prince George's Animal Management in Upper Marlboro. The full time ACO has also processed 19 adoptions.

We attach, for your review, tables summarizing ACO activity as well as the Animal Control Survey submitted to the Maryland Department of Agriculture which lists intakes and dispositions of dogs and cats for calendar year 2023.

Other activities of note were the two rabies clinics held in CY23, one prior to the pause staffed by volunteers and paid staff. The full time ACO has represented the program at multiple events in the City such as National Night Out, Maryland Day, College Park Day and career day at Hollywood Elementary School.

Activities of note for CY24 are the upgrades to the City's shelter, the hiring of a part time ACO, Municipal Scene articles, creating and presenting a public safety presentation on avoiding a bite incident, and working with Planning staff to submit a grant application to the Maryland Department of Agriculture Grant.

Staff appreciates the suggestions regarding more advocacy, volunteers, and foster help, please note that the AC program has continued to operate without incident despite the July 2023 pause. We do, however, anticipate other improvements to existing service and expansion during the coming fiscal year.
